





World Teachers' Day (WTD) recognises the valuable contributes teachers make to their communities. The event is celebrated on the last Friday in October. The QCT partnered with the Queensland Department of Education, Independent Schools Queensland, Queensland Catholic Education, Queensland Teachers Union and Independent Education Union (QLD & NT) to present a promotional campaign that included distribution of commemorative ribbons, downloadable digital assets, a social media campaign and the lighting of local landmarks across the state in the campaign's colours.
