

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



Standard 3 recognises that proficient teachers operate effectively at all stages of the teaching and learning cycle, including planning for learning and assessment, developing learning programs, teaching, assessing, providing feedback on student learning and reporting to parents/carers. Teachers demonstrating Standard 3 have a repertoire of effective teaching strategies and communication techniques and use these, along with a range of resources including ICTs, to implement welldesigned, engaging teaching programs and lessons. 

99,000 teachers are currently registered in

Queensland as at 1 April 2014.

6,364 new applications for teacher registration were received last year. 3,061 teachers were successful in moving from provisional to full registration in 2013. 755 teachers from other Australian states and territories, as well as New Zealand, were granted registration under mutual recognition in 2013. 572 overseas trained teachers were admitted to the register in 2013.
