Register

- Register is **up 2.2%** compared to 2021
- **8,618 applications** received up 15.9%
- 34.1% of applications were Queensland graduates
- 3,680 teachers were removed from the register –
 18.2% less than 2021

Demographics

- The average age of applicants is 35.8 years
- The average age of approved teachers is 45.9 years
- 78.3% of teachers on the register are female
- **52%** of teachers are **over 45** years of age (17.2% are 60 years or older)

Employment

- At the end of 2022 68.9% of approved teachers were known to be employed in permanent or long-term temporary teaching positions in Queensland schools
- 16.3% in Non-State Primary schools
- 17.9% in Non-State Secondary schools
- 38.6% in State Primary schools
- 27.1% in State Secondary schools

Permission to Teach*

- 95% enrolled in an ITE program
- 64% approved to teach in a state school
- General Primary, English, Mathematics, Health and Physical Education, Sciences and Design and Technology were the most prominent subject areas
- In 2022 there was a **288% increase** in PTT **applications** and a 231% increase in approvals compared to 2021
